2. The unit mail clerk (Pfc Grady) will deliver to headquarters Officers Quarters all mail to be censored. This will be accomplished at approximately 1700 hours each day. After censorship, the unit censor will seal the envelope and sign his name and rank legibly in ink on the lower left hand corner of the envelope. In the case of the folding type V-mail letter forms, the unit censor will sign his name and rank legibly in ink in the circle provided in the upper left corner on the face of the form. An impression of the authorized unit censorship stamp will then be placed above his name, on the inside circle and in the lower left hand corner of the form as folded.

3. The censorship stamp will be obtained from the officer who censored on the previous day. Care must be exercised with this stamp, and it should be in the custody of an officer at all times.

4. Mail delivered by 1700 hours will be censored, sealed and stamped by 0800 hours the following morning. The mail clerk will pick up censored mail at the same place he left it the previous evening.

5. Censors will not insert additions to nor make excerpts from communications which they censor, except as required for official purposes. Censors will not repeat or discuss information contained in communications they censor except as required in the line of duty.
